## Compumedics Best Poster Presentation

This prestigious Society prize, valued at \$500, will be awarded to the presentation judged the best Poster Presentation at the Annual Scientific Meeting. The aim of this award is to foster research and subsequent presentation at the Annual Scientific Meeting.

### Eligibility Criteria:

- Financial Member of ANZSRS (Associate, Ordinary or Life Membership).
- A maximum of two (2) consecutive Best Poster Awards may be won by any single presenter. The period of ineligibility in this instance is 1 year.
- All abstracts submitted to the Abstract Review Committee selected for poster presentations will be eligible for this Award, providing:
  - The presenter had significant input into all aspects of the presentation.
  - The work has not been presented under a similar title at another national Scientific Meeting.
  - If the work is to be presented at another Scientific Meeting, what meeting/s is it to be presented at, and who is the first author?
  - The research has not appeared in print in a peer-reviewed journal.

### Conditions:

- All documentation associated with abstract submission, including Conflict of Interest Statement, must be completed.
- Recipients will be expected to provide a letter to the Society Publications Editor for the Society Webpage summarising their presentation.
- Recipients are encouraged to use the Award to attend a national or international meeting of their choice.
- Recipients are required to give a presentation on the conference attended to their local branch meeting within 3 months of attending the meeting.
- Recipients must acknowledge the sponsor of the Award.
- Judging for the Best Poster Presentation will be in accordance to the ANZSRS Guidelines on Judging Presentations at Annual Scientific Meetings. This will include assessment of both “content” and “presentation”. These guidelines can be found on the Society website.
