The next branch meeting, to be held at Monash Medical centre on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> September, follows the theme of thoracic anatomy. More details to follow in an invitation shortly....

A little discussion has ensued following our last branch news that commented on and raised questions regarding the latest ATS/ERS guidelines for lung function testing and interpretation. In particular, regarding the following question:

- When monitoring lung function (eg clinical notes state “CF for review”), do we need to report spirometry – “there is an obstructive ventilatory defect”, or should we be just comparing results to previous – “ In comparison to previous results, there has been a decline in FEV<sub>1</sub>.”

Conversations around this have led us to the conclusion that a report needs to stand on it’s own, even if it is being used for monitoring – so we should report the findings from the test as well as a comparison. Additionally, if the subject slips from normal to abnormal between visits, this may be missed, if only comparisons are made. We’re interested in others takes on this.
