At the AGM will be decided the next Executive Committee, which will take up responsibilities from the 2007 AGM. Nominations must be submitted, in writing, to the Secretary prior to the AGM. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary. Nominees must be *financial, Ordinary* members of the Society and be proposed and seconded by Ordinary members. If you are unable to attend the AGM, please also inform the Secretary.

Also to be decided at the AGM is the period for payment for subscription fees. This was recently reviewed by the Board as the current Constitution allows for a member to be financial for up to 18 months after their fees are due, during which time they are allowed full member privileges, such as member registration at two Annual Scientific Meetings and access to the members only area of the web site, even though they may not have paid their fees. This allows for the potential of abuse of the 'goodwill' of the Society. The notice of the proposed Constitution Change was circulated with the 2006 renewal notice and will be considered and voted on by the eligible voting members at the AGM.
