ASM Abstract Submissions

The Abstract Submission closing date has now passed (26th November 2007). Due to the APSR congress – the deadline was extended to 5th December 2007. Notification was sent to members via email from the Website Editor (thanks Kevin). The Abstract Review Committee, headed by Brenton Eckert, will be reviewing the abstracts over the next week or so and notification of acceptance should be sent to all authors prior to Christmas.

Program:

Speakers of the month:

Andrew Bersten is Professor and Head of Department of Critical Care Medicine at Flinders University and Flinders Medical Centre. Following a research Fellowship at the University of Western Ontario with Professor WJ Sibbald he returned to Flinders in late 1988 as an Intensive Care Specialist. Current research interests include mechanical ventilation, ARDS and the lung in heart failure. Measurement of respiratory mechanics at the bedside, in animal and laboratory models has provided important insights and the ability to explore different hypotheses. Andrew will be presenting his expert knowledge in the measurement of lung mechanics in restrictive disease in the ICU setting.

Professor Simon Gandevia is a medical graduate and neurophysiologist with a major clinical interest in the neural control of breathing. With more than 250 published articles, Simon's research focuses on how the brain controls human limb muscles and human respiratory muscles in health and disease. One emphasis has been the development of tests of neuromuscular function which can be applied to understand pathological changes in patients. This has included work on dyspnoea, phrenic nerve testing, diaphragm and intercostals muscle function and more recently, on the control of upper airways muscles. Simon will be presenting his expert knowledge on the inspiratory muscles in health and disease.

CRFS Workshop (Monday am):

While the program speakers have yet to be finalised – the topic for review this ASM will be The Lung Parenchyma. The themes that will be explored include:

- anatomy and function
- diseases of the lung parenchyma
- normal and abnormal gas exchange at the blood-air interface (the basics)
- tests of lung parenchymal function and their interpretation

Some time will also be spent reviewing the upcoming changes to the CRFS examination. As with other years, places will be limited – so ensure you register early for this workshop.

Clinical Presentation Meeting

The final clinical presentation session for 2007 was held on Wednesday 14th November and was hosted by Dept Respiratory Medicine, PMH. Two presentations were given:

1. Karla Logie presented on ' Investigating Exhaled Breath Temperature'. Karla is an Honours student under the supervision of Graham Hall. In preparation for her Honours viva presentation, Karla was seeking to gain presentation experience and feedback. Karla gave an excellent presentation covering: the pros and cons of the currently available methods of determining airway inflammation in children, the need for a non-invasive measurement of airway inflammation in children, exhaled breath temperature (EBT) methodology, comparisons of FeNO and EBT methodologies, evaluation of the relationship between EBT and inflammatory respiratory disease in 10-year-olds. Questions and queries followed and presentation tips offered.
2. The second presentation was made jointly by Christine Nathan and Sally Young: 'ANZSRS-WA: Where From and Where To?' This presentation was a round-up of the last three years of Branch activities under the current incumbents.

Clinical Meeting Sponsorship: CN thanked Grant Vincent of Mayo Healthcare for ongoing generous sponsorship of the clinical presentation meetings throughout 2007.

This session also provided the final opportunity for a Branch business meeting for the year and quite a lot of business was discussed. This is summarized as follows:

WA Branch Positions Falling Vacant

During their presentation CN & SY advised that they would be resigning, as State Representatives, effective December 31st, 2007. Chris Nathan will continue as WA representative to the Board, and both Chris and Sally will continue with their various current committee duties.

CN & SY advised that there are three positions that are to be vacated effective 31st December and, therefore, require nominations. The positions are: Regional Reps x 2, TSANZ-WA Associates Committee.

Regional Representatives: With the Society governance changes being proposed, regional representation around Australia will, at some yet to be determined future date, be reduced to a single State rep. CN & SY proposed that it would be beneficial to the Branch that from January 1st, 2008 until the governance restructure occurs, the State should continue to have 2 state reps. Once the new governance structure is applied, one of the reps becomes the State Representative and the other a 'State Representative Elect' (as proposed by Gary Nolan). These proposals would allow a sharing of the workload of state based activities and also enable 'training' of an interested person who may wish to in the future, nominate for State Rep. CN & SY advised that they are offering mentorship for the new Regional Reps, if they so wish.

TSANZ-WA Associates Committee: Membership of this committee involves assisting with the planning and running of the annual local ASM. Sina Panic advised that this position offers an excellent opportunity to gain experience in both committee membership and meeting planning and organisation. The rep on this committee is required to liaise closely with the ANZSRS-WA Regional reps.

Nominations for the above positions were called for and closed Monday 26th November. As only one nomination was received for the TSANZ-WA position, the nominee has been elected unopposed. As three nominations were received for the 2 positions of local rep, an election is to be held. The ballot papers have been distributed to the WA Branch and voting closes 5pm Monday 10th December.

Successful candidates for all positions shall be announced on Wednesday 12th December at the end-of-year dinner.

The Combined TSANZ/ANZSRS (WA branch) Annual Scientific Meeting

Sina Panic, ANZSRS-WA rep on TSANZ-WA Assoc Committee, advised that the weekend meeting was well attended but attendance at the Saturday night dinner was down on previous years. A concurrent ANZRS-WA session was held on the Saturday afternoon at which Paul Guy presented on 'Societal Governance'. This session was successful and has continued to generate a lot of discussion amongst local members. The TSANZ Associates committee is to meet shortly to review this year's ASM and to also advise of the new committee for 2008. Sina shall be vacating the position of ANZSRS-WA rep on this committee. The meeting thanked Sina for her efforts throughout 2007.

TSANZ WA-Branch Executive Committee

Sally Young advised that there was no activity to report and that this committee has completed all meetings for 2007 and will reconvene in early 2008.

ACOSH

Mari Noffsinger reported the last ACOSH meeting was cancelled and rescheduled for December. Mari advised that she is willing to continue in 2008, as one of the ANZSRS-WA representatives on ACOSH. Sunalene Devadason is the second ANZSRS-WA rep.

ANZSRS-WA Respiratory Symposium 2007

SY reported that this meeting was successful. There was a group discussion on the merit of continuing with this meeting. The opinion expressed by those in attendance was that the Resp Symposium was a highlight of the ANZSRS-WA presentation year and was a valuable contribution to the general respiratory community meeting calendar. Sally will continue to have a role in the development and organisation of this meeting.

ANZSRS Governance Subcommittee

Chris Nathan reported that the Governance Sub-Committee has made significant headway on redrafting the Constitution and a Governance information pack for the general membership. The redrafted Constitution shall be lodged with a specialist lawyer for review. Chris advised the meeting that members are able to keep up-to-date on Governance issues via the Society website, where governance documents are regularly posted and updated.

TSANZ-WA Lung Club Dinner Meeting

The final dinner meeting was held on Wednesday 21st November at The University Club at University of Western Australia. ANZSRS was well represented at this meeting at which the Respiratory Advanced Trainee Young Investigator Award session was held. The presentations were of great interest and high standard. This meeting was sponsored by NicoMed.

TSANZ-WA & LIWA (Lung Institute of Western Australia) Dinner Meeting

A last minute addition to the ANZSRS-WA Branch 'meeting and eating' calendar was held on Tuesday 13th November at 'The Hyatt'. Again, this was well attended by local Branch members. The invited speaker was Prof Robin Taylor who gave an outstanding presentation on 'Inflammometry – Shedding Light on the Diagnosis and Management of Non-Specific Respiratory Symptoms.' This presentation covered the history, the early hopes and expectation, and the realities of measuring and interpreting FeNO. The meeting was sponsored by AstraZeneca.

Governance & Vision Sub-committee Report

Since the last website update, the Governance subcommittee has finalised the proposed constitution (Society rules) and this has been forwarded to the Board Chair for distribution and comment from the Board. The subcommittee also included a copy of the Incorporations Act SA 1985 for reference and a list of proposed by-laws and schedules required to be read in conjunction with the proposed Society rules.

We have drafted a couple of these schedules and by-laws to allow the immediate operation of the rules. The remainder are merely a list of those needing drafting in the short, but not immediate term. There will be many more by-laws and policy documents required to ensure the efficient and proper functioning of the Society – but this will be the role of the new Board and Executive Committee

We have secured the services of a constitutional lawyer to review the documentation following Board approval and before it is distributed to the wider membership for viewing. A special resolution will then be called for a change to the proposed Society rules at the 2008 AGM. This will be a very important meeting and we will require approval from 75% of all

voting members in order to pass the resolution. Notification will be sent at least 21 days prior to the resolution being voted on.

We are hoping that the proposed rules will be available via the website (members only area) in late January 2008.

The committee also hopes to have a couple more education packages for the membership over the next couple of months.
