Speakers of the month:

Chris Zappala, until recently, has worked at the Royal Brompton Hospital, London, in the Interstitial Lung Diseases Unit. Developing an interest in this challenging area of respiratory medicine he has embarked on a body of research examining how change in serial lung function parameters describes disease behaviour and predicts survival. He has worked extensively across the breadth of diffuse parenchymal lung diseases as both clinician and researcher and in so doing has challenged the notion of rigid interpretation of lung function. He is about to embark on collaborative work relating structure to function in hypersensitivity pneumonitis and sarcoidosis. Now back in Brisbane, Chris will be our first keynote speaker in the first session of our ASM. He will present a brief review of ILD and some of his research findings in this field.

Andrew Wilson is a paediatric respiratory physician at Princess Margaret Hospital in Western Australia. He is an active researcher in the fields of paediatric sleep and respiratory medicine and is responsible for the ventilatory support clinical service at Princess Margaret Hospital. He has a strong clinical interest in restrictive lung disease in children, particularly with reference to neuromuscular disease. Andrew will be presenting in the second of the concurrent sessions on Saturday morning, looking at restrictive lung diseases in the paediatric population – a great opportunity for members working in paediatrics to review this area.

Research Workshop (Monday am):

The content for the Research Workshop has been finalised.

Prof Don Campbell, a Respiratory Physician and Professor of Medicine at Monash University will share his vast knowledge in Biostatistics and Prof Martin Tobin, an ICU physician, Chicago, Illinois, will use his knowledge as a past editor of "The Blue Journal" to help us better write a manuscript for publication.

As per previous years, spaces will be limited, so register early to participate in this rare opportunity.

Monday Afternoon:

We have received confirmation in the last month that there will be two combined ANZSRS/TSANZ symposia again in 2008.

Following lunch a session reviewing lung function testing in pre-schoolers will be conducted in conjunction with the TSANZ Paediatric Special Interest Group and following afternoon tea, a master class in static lung volume measurement will provide all with the opportunity to reflect on the principles, methods and interpretation of these tests.
