Technipro will soon be introducing the KoKo Mate.

This spirometer brings portability and simplicity to a new level. The KoKoMate Spirometer is a hand-held portable device capable of performing both pre- and post-bronchodilator forced expiratory manoeuvres and calculating the standard spirometric indices used to determine severity of airway obstruction. The KoKoMate has been designed to meet the Office Spirometry* guidelines published by the National Lung Health Education Program (NLHEP). The testing is simple, the quality assurance messages are in plain language, and the interpretation is straightforward. In addition to operating on its own, it expands the capability of the PC-based KoKo Spirometer by providing a handheld portable unit, which can be used for remote testing and then be brought back for downloading or printing.

- For users needing a simple hard copy report showing both Flow-Volume and Volume-Time graphs, an optional wireless printer cradle connects directly to a standard office printer.

- A powerful option of the KoKoMate is the ability to send test results and graphics to the KoKoPFT spirometry software for advanced data manipulation, storage, reporting and trending.
- The KoKoMate utilizes a disposable pre-calibrated flow tube. The flow tubes are individually packaged and are for single patient use only. An optional non-disposable flow tube is also available.
